

State-by-State Apprenticeship Funding Breakdown

This report summarizes the most accessible state-by-state breakdown tied to the recent federal apprenticeship investment the user referenced as roughly \$160 million. The closest official nationwide state-by-state source located is the U.S. Department of Labor's June 30, 2025 award of nearly \$84 million in State Apprenticeship Expansion Formula grants to 50 states and territories; the separate July 2026 announcement of nearly \$162 million was awarded through five national cooperative agreements and was not published as a state-by-state allocation list. What the \$162 million covers

The U.S. Department of Labor announced nearly \$162 million on July 6, 2026 through five cooperative agreements to expand Registered Apprenticeship in priority sectors including defense industrial base, shipbuilding, maritime manufacturing, AI infrastructure, semiconductors, nuclear energy, telecommunications, information technology, and automotive technician pathways.[cite:1]

Those awards went to five national recipients rather than to every state individually: Florida Department of Commerce (\$40 million), Jobs for the Future (\$40 million), Wireless Infrastructure Association (\$29.9 million), The Trustees of Clark University (\$27 million), and ASE Foundation (\$25 million).[cite:1]

Because no official state-by-state disbursement table for the \$162 million announcement was found in the available federal release, the state-by-state table below uses the latest official nationwide state allocation table that was publicly posted by the U.S. Department of Labor: the June 30, 2025 State Apprenticeship Expansion Formula grants.[cite:6]

Who to contact

For every state, the most reliable starting point is the federal U.S. Department of Labor Registered Apprenticeship contact page, which identifies whether the state operates through a Federal Office of Apprenticeship contact or a State Apprenticeship Agency contact.[cite:page:2]

Programs, schools, and directories

Programs and school partners are usually organized through state apprenticeship agencies, workforce boards, technical college systems, community college systems, or occupation-specific sponsors rather than one single national school list.[cite:page:2][cite:15]

Examples from the reviewed sources include ApprenticeshipNC through the North Carolina Community College System, the Colorado Registered Apprenticeship Program Directory and K-

12 apprenticeship contact directory, California community college apprenticeship program listings, and Alabama's statement that every community college has at least one registered apprenticeship available through local institutions.[cite:3][cite:13][cite:7][cite:10]

Important limitation

A complete state-by-state list of every contact person, program, and school tied specifically to the July 2026 \$162 million announcement was not publicly available in the federal announcement reviewed. That announcement appears to fund national intermediaries and consortia, so the next practical step is to match each state to its apprenticeship agency contact and then pull that state's registered program directory from [Apprenticeship.gov](https://www.apprenticeship.gov) or the state agency site.[cite:1][cite:page:2][cite:15]
